





Student Wellbeing & Engagement

Brighton Secondary School supports students through a multi-layered structure, ensuring strong engagement and wellbeing. Each student is assigned to a home group within a House, part of either the Middle or Senior sub-school. Their home group teacher serves as the primary contact for student needs, working closely with a dedicated support team, including:

- Year Level Leaders
- Wellbeing for Learning Leaders
- Youth Workers
- Head of School
- Clinical Psychologist (for evidence-informed social-emotional development programs)

The home group program supports the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum and other targeted wellbeing initiatives, fostering:

- Personal, social, and interpersonal skill development
- Monitoring of academic achievement, engagement, and attendance
- Active engagement with school values
- Student agency, leadership, and active citizenship
- A strong sense of belonging and connection with trusted adults

Learning Support

Our Inclusive Education Leader and specialist staff provide targeted intervention and personalized support for students with verified learning needs. Programs include:

- Year 7 Literacy & Numeracy Intervention Classes
- Tier 2 & 3 Intervention Programs (social skills development, Modified SACE, and Recognised Community Learning projects)

Aboriginal Education Team

A dedicated team, including four Aboriginal Education Teachers (AETs) and an Aboriginal Secondary Education and Transition Officer (ASETO), supports Aboriginal learners. Each student has an Individual Learning Plan with a focus on engagement and post-school pathways.

Co-Curricular Activities

A dedicated School Life Coordinator promotes a wide range of co-curricular activities, fostering student connectedness and a sense of belonging.
